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ANNOTATION: The Methods of Classroom Teaching. Teaching strategies are the methods the teacher employs to help students get the most out of their learning experience. Teaching methods are often divided into two broad categories: teacher-centred methods (also called direct instruction) and learner-centred methods (also called indirect instruction or inquiry-based learning). An effective teacher knows several methods, some teacher-directed and others learner-directed. There is no “best” method of teaching.

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Types of teaching methods include differentiated instruction, lecture-based instruction, technology-based learning, group learning, individual learning, inquiry-based learning, kinesthetic learning, game-based learning and expeditionary learning.

The Methods of Classroom Teaching

Based on the writer's readings and experiences, teaching methods can be grouped into ten, namely (1) Presentation, (2) Demonstration, (3) Reading, (4) Drama, (5) Discussion, (6) Cases, (7) Graphics, (8) Playlikes, (9) Gaming, and (10) Learner's Directed Inquiry. Flipped classrooms, differentiated instruction, inquiry-based learning, personalized learning and more. Not only are there dozens of teaching methods to

explore, it is also important to have a sense for how they often overlap or interrelate. Teaching methods are often divided into two broad categories: teacher-centred methods (also called direct instruction) and learner-centred methods (also called indirect instruction or inquiry-based learning). An effective teacher knows several methods, some teacher-directed and others learner-directed. There is no “best” method of teaching. However, many researchers today agree that including more student-centered learning approaches in the classroom can improve learning. Using only a teacher-centered approach leaves out many skills and learning opportunities for students. There are a variety of teaching methods and strategies available to instructors to help their students learn or develop knowledge and skills. The Seven Principles:

Encourage contact between students and faculty.

Develop reciprocity and cooperation among students.

Encourage active learning.

Give prompt feedback.

Emphasize time on task.

Communicate high expectations.

Respect diverse talents and ways of learning.

What are the 4 methods of learning?

Perhaps the most simple way of describing 'learning styles' is to say that they are different methods of learning or understanding new information, the way a person takes in, understand, expresses and remembers information. There are 4 predominant learning styles: Visual, Auditory, Read/Write, and Kinaesthetic.
